Doosan Forklift Parts - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an international and intercontinental organization that comprises of Defense Industry Products, Industrial Vehicles, Diesel Engines, Automation Systems, Machine Tools and Construction Equipment.

In the United States, Doosan Infracore America Corporation is headquartered in Suwanee, Georgia. It is home to a 170,000 square foot production facility, which is the home of the Compact Equipment and Construction department. West Caldwell, New Jersey is home to the Machine Tool division and Cleveland, Ohio is home to the Forklift division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction client requirements.

There are well over 220 Doosan service and sales locations operating in Canada and the United States. Also, there are more than 90 independent sellers moving lift truck materials and materials handling equipment. This system allows Doosan Infracore America to aggressively compete in this competitive market. The forklift product line impressively features 63 different machines consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion forklifts. Capacities of these various truck designs vary from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are designed in an ISO 9001 qualified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest growing forklift company in the North American marketplace, due to their stability in retaining a high degree of customer service quality and optimum product functioning to all Doosan Infracore Lift Truck users. The U.S. forklift division situated in Cleveland has a professional team experienced in Sales, Purchasing, Advertising, Logistical and Technical Support.

At first the domestic lift truck marketplace in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. began in 1960, to import fully assembled lift trucks as part of a domestic equipment expansion project. Sales of these goods were primarily targeted to state-run companies, large scale corporations, and the armed forces. This eventually led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division commenced business operations throughout Korea to service and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a lift truck production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical education became the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Daewoo began the first domestic lift truck business in 1967, and rapidly acquired a whopping 90% share in the Korean Materials Handling market. By the 1980's, Daewoo's superior technological improvements combined with sales success placed them in a position of substantial expansion of their lift truck operations.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a cooperative enterprise project to respond to competitive pressures in the US materials handling industry. This endeavor drastically expanded Daewoo's lift truck sales. Construction was completed in 1984 to facilitate a new plant which helped set up the business for the manufacture of high end added-value products suitable for export. In 1993, the corporation had a international sales network and started exporting models they had established through in-house technology, as an independent product. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing growth possibilities into international markets.
